Since 1962 the River Thames Society has influenced and supported:

- Construction of the Thames Barrier
- Creation of the Thames Path
- Removal of sewage from the tidal river
- Clean-ups of rubbish along the Thames
- Retention of lock-keepers' houses
- Recognition and listing of weirs and structures of historical significance
- Foundation of the River & Rowing and Docklands Museums
- Educational and conservation activities, including at Bondig Bank, our nature reserve.

But... much remains to be done

- Planning proposals and building projects need to be scrutinised to ensure that people, the environment and the river benefit.
- Locks, navigational structures and flood control measures need to be maintained and improved.
- Entry points such as stairs, causeways and drawdocks need to be protected and made accessible.
- Boatyards, dry-docks and other marine facilities need to be safeguarded.
- Recreational, transport and commercial use of the river need to be further developed and balanced.
